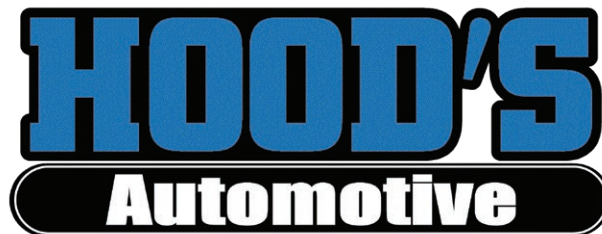
Labor Day is celebrated in the United States on the first Monday of September. The jumbles here include both historically significant words and ways people celebrate today.

UNDER PRESSURE?
YOUR TPMS
DASHBOARD LIGHT
LETS YOU KNOW!

Newer model vehicles are equipped with a tire pressure monitoring system (TPMS) to warn drivers that at least one of their tires is underinflated. The dashboard light looks like an exclamation point inside of a horseshoe and, if illuminated, should be addressed immediately, says the non-profit Car Care Council.

“When the TPMS light goes on, it should not be ignored. Driving on underinflated tires can lead to an accident or cause damage to your vehicle,” said Rich White, Executive Director of the Car Care Council. “As part of a proactive auto care plan, tire pressure should be checked monthly, including the spare, as tires can lose pressure due to a number of factors, including seasonal temperature changes.”

All vehicles manufactured after September 2007 feature a tire pressure monitoring system. When the TPMS warning light comes on, it means pressure in at least one of the tires has fallen 25 percent under the recommended pressure. Low tire pressure can be due to a number of factors, including climate, road hazards and driving conditions. Once the tires are inflated to the correct pressure as outlined in the owner’s manual, the warning light should go off. However, some vehicles may require a professional service technician to reset the light.

Tires that are not properly inflated also add rolling resistance that makes the engine work harder to move the vehicle. This can lead to lower gas mileage and potential damage to the vehicle.

“In addition to safety concerns, underinflated tires can cost you more at the pump,” said White. “Simply inflating tires to the proper level can improve gas mileage by 3.3 percent or 10 cents per gallon!” www.carcare.org

“FUN TO PLAY WITH, NOT TO EAT!”

National Play-Doh Day is observed annually on September 16th.

Play-Doh modeling compound started out as wallpaper cleaner. Inventor Joe McVicker learned from a teacher that kids usually found modeling clay too hard to manipulate. Discovering that the squishy cleaning product he manufactured could substitute, McVicker shipped some to the school.

After teachers & kids raved, he offered to supply the product to all Cincinnati schools. More rave reviews followed. McVicker showcased the modeling clay at a national education convention in 1955, & word spread to Macy’s & Marshall Field’s. By 1956, the wallpaper cleaner had become Play-Doh. A year later, the manufacturer offered a softer Play-Doh in primary colors. Kids mixed these to make other colors, ending inevitably in brown. Captain Kangaroo endorsed Play-Doh, & so did Miss Frances from Ding Dong School. Play-Doh Pete appeared on product cans in 1960. The Fun Factory let kids extrude the material into interesting shapes, making mock hair, colorful spaghetti, & pretend ice cream that wouldn’t melt.

In the 1980s, Play-Doh expanded its palette to eight colors. Later versions sparkled with glitter, glowed in the dark, or smelled like shaving cream. Recent estimates say that kids have played with 700 million pounds of Play-Doh.



SEPT 3RD - WORLD SKYSCRAPER DAY

World Skyscraper Day takes place on September 3rd, in honor of Louis H. Sullivan’s birthday (1856), the architect credited with the first skyscrapers.

Because of Sullivan’s remarkable accomplishments in design & construction at such a critical point in architectural history, he has been described as the “father” of the American skyscraper.

SEPT 11TH - OBSERVE PATRIOT DAY!

In the United States, Patriot Day, observed as the “National Day of Service and Remembrance”, occurs on September 11 of each year in memory of the people killed in the September 11 attacks of 2001. In the immediate aftermath of the attacks, President George W. Bush proclaimed Friday, September 14, 2001, as a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance for the Victims of the Terrorist Attacks on 9/11.

A bill to make September 11th a national day of mourning was introduced in the U.S. House on October 25, 2001, by Rep. Vito Fossella (R-NY), with 22 co-sponsors, among them 11 Democrats and 11 Republicans. The bill requested that the President designate September 11 of each year as Patriot Day. Joint Resolution 71 passed the House by a vote of 407–0, with 25 members not voting. The bill passed the Senate unanimously on November 30th & President Bush signed the resolution into law on December 18th. On September 4, 2002, President Bush used the authority of the resolution to proclaim September 11, 2002, as the first Patriot Day.



Tasty Peach Cobbler!



Ingredients		
• 4 cups peaches; ripe, peeled, pitted and sliced	• 1 tablespoon lemon zest	
• 1/2 cup sugar	• 1 tablespoon lemon juice	
• 2 tablespoons cornstarch

• 1/2 cup butter unsalted, cut into cubes	• 1/4 teaspoon salt	• 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
• 1 cup all-purpose flour all purpose	• 1/2 cup sugar granulated	• 1 cup milk
• 1 tablespoon baking powder	• 1 large egg	
Directions		
Step 1- Begin by preheating your oven to 375 degrees F.		
Step 2- To make the filling, add peaches, sugar, cornstarch, lemon zest, and lemon juice to a medium-sized saucepan. Bring the mixture to a simmer for 5 minutes. Stir continuously until the peaches start to soften.		
Step 3- Melt the butter by placing the cubes in a 9x9 baking dish and putting it into the preheated oven until the butter has melted.		
Step 4- To create the cobbler batter, add the flour, baking powder, salt, sugar, egg, vanilla, and milk to a bowl and whisk until the flour is just combined.		
Step 5- Pour the peaches into the baking dish over the melted butter and pour the batter evenly over the peaches.		
Step 6- Bake in the oven for 40-45 minutes or until the cobbler is a nice, golden brown. Serve immediately with some ice cream.
